Peter is a Sustainability consultant and educator. He splits his consulting time between **Satoria Consulting** (www.Satoria.com), a practice he founded in 2005 that provides Sustainability consulting services to businesses, educational institutions and non-profits, and the **Sustainable Business Leadership Program** (www.SustainableBusinessLeader.org), a non-profit providing Sustainability consulting and “green certification” to small & medium-sized companies in Greater Boston, Massachusetts. Peter is **Managing Partner** at *Satoria* which operates via a partnership model to perform services such as: Life Cycle Assessments, Carbon Inventories and Goal Setting, Green Building Strategies, Energy Conservation, Organizational Sustainability Plans, Sustainability Measurement & Reporting Protocols, and Organizational Development/Education. Peter is **Senior Advisor** at the *Sustainable Business Leader Program* and helps implement a Sustainability Assessment System for clients, as well as develop Sustainability Action Plans based upon the Assessments. Prior to working in Sustainability, Peter worked in Strategic Planning & Financial Analysis for John Hancock as well as Real Estate Investment and Development for various organizations, including Boston Capital, Meredith Management, Inc. and the Boston Redevelopment Authority. In addition, Peter co-founded, managed and sold an Internet services (consulting/design/programming) firm from 1997 - 2002.

Peter is also an educator. He is Adjunct Faculty in the *Leadership for Change Program* at the Carroll School of Management at Boston College (www.bc.edu/lfc). Peter teaches the Sustainability Module for the program, as well as lectures on Leadership Practices and Organizational Development. He has also led numerous workshops and authored articles on Integrating Sustainability into Higher Education, Developing Sustainability Plans, Promoting Inter-sectoral Partnerships for Sustainability, The Role of Non-Profits in the Sustainability Movement, and the Importance of Vibrant Local Economies.
